It was really nice to see our older students working with the younger students and there was certainly a lot achieved in the space of a couple of hours. The council were really amazed with how everyone worked together. I'd like to thank the parents who joined in and helped too. It was a great event as part of Parks Week and I am sure this will become an annual event.






## **Kotare Hub**

### Kuaka Hub

Kuaka have completed some great work recently using a variety of digital technology. We have recently used an app called Padlet for our reading response answers. This app allows students to upload digital texts and online resources to their presentation to support their learning. They can record their answers in text or record them verbally and they can include a range of visual information (images, video clips, diagrams, maps etc) to promote their understanding of the text.

Our students have also engaged in some interesting learning on the Moa recently. We learned facts like the Moa shell was only 1mm thick and that it is thought that the smaller male incubated the eggs, not the larger female. We also found an audio clip of what is thought to be the sound Moa would make! Awesome work K-Hub!
