Dear Parents

Welcome to Week 6 of Term 2

It is normally this time of the term that we look over the attendance for the term and make contact with parents whose children dip below the 85% attendance rate. I was really surprised to look over some data that the Ministry of Education sent out recently. It showed that our Year 4 to 8 attendance rate is really high compared to schools in the greater Wellington area. There is still some work that needs to be done with the Year 1 to 3 students though.

There has been a bit of talk in the media recently about how bad the attendance rates throughout New Zealand are. I would like to take the opportunity to remind parents that when children are at school on a regular basis they have much more success than those who are not. When children miss days of school regularly they miss large chunks of teaching which puts them under more stress as they are a bit lost. It is also difficult for children to establish relationships with teachers and other students when they are having too many days away from school.

I have also noticed a worrying trend this year of children turning up to school quite late. It is important that the children are at school before 8:55am as when they come in late and the teachers are already teaching, it can't be expected that the teacher stops taking a group just to get one person on track. This is really hard on children as they are quite often confused about what they should be doing.

House Sports

I would like to thank our school leaders who have been running the soccer competition that Team Tarànui have been competing in at lunchtime. Some of the games have been really close and I have seen quite a bit of determination to win the game for their house. The leaders have set everything up ready to start the games. They have refereed the games and managed subs etc.

We have been given the date of Friday the 16th of July as the completion date for the remodel of the junior block. We will be asking for some help in the second week of the holidays to move everything back to where it should be and then the junior and senior teachers will have the rest of the week to set their classrooms up.

It will be great to have our school hall back as we have a school production to get underway and I know that Home and School have a few fundraisers up their sleeves as well
