The Board of Trustees invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their children at Foxton Beach School.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which can be found on our school [website](#).

Applications can be made in writing or by emailing the Principal, principal2@foxtonbeach.school.nz

The deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is **Friday 14th October 2022**.

The Board has determined that there will be up to **20 spaces for out of zone enrolments in years 1 to 5**. If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot.

If a ballot is required it will be held on Friday 28th October 2022.

Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

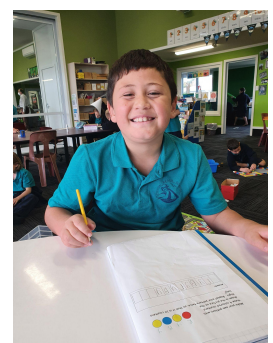

Team Kotare

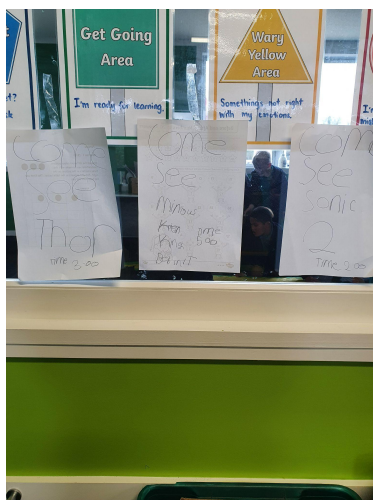
Production

Our Learning

This term we have a focus on building our confidence, self esteem and ability to foster positive relationships. We are working on some different focuses around this. Something we have covered so far is what makes an ideal friend so that they can relate to others inside and outside the classroom at school. This week we are looking at what makes me special. Every child in our class is unique

We have been working on fractions in maths and getting into some challenging learning here. Hopefully you can look for fractions in the real world with your children - especially in cooking or baking.

There is an amazing art project in the works that integrates geometry - Tapa Cloths. This has so far been a great learning experience, and we can't wait to see the final pieces!



For literacy we have been trying to integrate texts from our different topics, such as texts about accepting differences and about Tapa cloths. We are writing persuasive pieces and reading some texts around this too. So your child might come home trying to persuade you to get a new pet - hopefully they do a good job of it!

Just a reminder that whānau are welcome to come into class and check out their children's learning at any point. Pop in before school and have your child show you what they've been doing, whether this be on their Chromebook or in their books. We would really love to see more whānau coming in when you can.

Managing Self/Reminders

Please remember the following:

Kuaka Hub

The Kuaka Hub has been doing some great work with Cheryl Murphy from Manaiakalani. She is working with both of our classes every Monday this term, helping us to become cyber smart and more digitally fluent. We're learning to use the Learn, Create, Share concept which emphasises whānau involvement in students' learning. We've worked on a class website that we use as a portal for the students to visit to find resources and we're writing our first class blog posts at the moment.
