Kia ora e te whānau.

I would like to start my newsletter by congratulating Katy Morresey on her appointment as the new Principal of Foxton Beach School. We are trying to change our approaches at school to ensure children are coming to school everyday.

Due to the fact that all teachers had to go to the meeting in Levin it meant that we had to close the school. I feel that these meetings could have been achieved over Zoom or completed after school.


